Hina-matsuri, also known as Girls' Day, Doll's Day or Momo no Sekku (Peach festival), is a Japanese traditional festival celebrated on the 3rd of March to wish all girls health and growth.

Every year before the 3rd of March, parents who have daughters in their household display a set of Hina-matsuri dolls, which represent a Heian period wedding. We normally put some food on display such as multi-coloured rice crackers, Ichigo-daifuku, and Chirashi-Sushi.

Ichigo (Strawberry) Daifuku: Fresh strawberry wrapped in sweet white bean paste and our soft, chewy mochi.

Sakura mochi: There's nothing that symbolises Spring in Japan more than Sakura-mochi! A wonderful, smooth Adzuki bean paste centre, with sticky rice, and wrapped in an edible, pickled cherry-blossom leaf.

Nerikiri: Lantern (Matcha), Tono (Adzuki, purple design), and Hime (Yuzu, pink design) special Hina-matsuri designs.
